INTRODUCTION

The House of Representatives occupies a unique place in Nigeria's democracy. Members of the House are expected to play a variety of roles beyond the traditional responsibilities of law making and oversight. Members of the House of Representatives advocate for the policy, political and development agenda of their communities. They also provide welfare and empowerment programmes to help people escape from poverty and meet the expectations of the Nigerian people. Rt. Hon Yusuf Gagdi came to the HOR with a profound appreciation of the high expectations of his constituents, and a manifest determination to exceed those expectations. Across Pankshin/Kanke/Kanam Federal Constituency, testimonies abound of the incredible achievements of Rt. Hon Yusuf Gagdi in his first term. Some of those achievements are highlighted herein.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE AT THE FEDERAL HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

i. Peace and National Security

Hon. Gagdi's commitment to ensuring peace, stability and security in Nigeria is evident in his push for policing system reforms. He sponsored the Police Act (Amendment) Bill 2020, as the then colonial 1943 Police Act regulated the Nigeria Police Force (NPF) for 77 years and was no longer fit for purpose. Through its implementation, the 2020 Police Act provides for a more efficient and effective police service that is based on the principles of accountability, transparency, protection of human rights and fundamental freedoms and partnership with other security agencies. It also brings about a modern Police that is responsive to the security needs of Nigeria citizens at all levels. He further championed the Nigerian Police Academy (Establishment, Etc.) Bill, 2020 to ensure that the members of the police force are well trained and equipped to deliver in their mandate to serve and to protect the Nigerian people.

ii. Constitutional Reforms

During the 9th Assembly, Gagdi's Constitutional reforms centered on two key amendments. Firstly, an increase in the retirement age for Judicial officers and related matters as outlined in Section 291

of the Constitution. Secondly, a proposed alteration to Section 215, which pertains to the appointment of the Inspector-General and control of the Nigeria Police Force.

iii. Education Initiatives and Interventions

Rt. Hon. Gagdi's commitment to education continued at the House as he championed the Federal College of Education, Dengi –Kanam (Establishment) Bill, 2022, Admiralty University of Nigeria, Ibusa (Est) Bill, 2021, the Federal University of Education, Pankshin (Establishment) Bill 2020, and Nigerian Police Academy (Establishment, Etc.) Bill, 2020. He consistently sponsored the education of individuals from his constituency.

iv. Accountability and Transparency

Rt. Hon. Gagdi Commitment to accountability and transparency is manifested in his performance of his oversight responsibilities while serving as the Chairman, House Committee Nigerian Navy and other House committees.

PREAMBLE

Yusuf Adamu Gagdi, through dedication and dint of hard work, has engraved his name in gold in the minds of thousands of his constituents and earned for himself the status of an all-round modern legislator with a perfect blend of the qualities outlined above. Rt. Hon. Gagdi has realized that the opportunity to serve his constituents is beyond the rhetoric of office but involves the convergence of ideas that are built around the needs of the people. Between 11th June 2019 to date, attention of the Hon. Member has been drawn to the myriad issues confronting the Nigerian State and in particular, his constituency of Pankshin/Kanke/Kanam through Consultations. To set the record straight, he has met with various pressure groups and political associations including Youth Groups, Women Groups, Traditional Rulers, Religious Leaders and Political Groups across different divides within and outside his Constituency. This Consultation resulted amongst other things in the setting up of the Gobak Blueprint Committee in 2019.

Rt. Hon. Yusuf Adamu Gagdi is a member of the 9th House of Representatives, representing Pankshin/Kanke/Kanam Federal Constituency. He is an economist, seasoned educator and an expert in intelligence, security management, peace and conflict resolution. Passionate about education and representation, he made a deliberate decision to enter politics with the intention of effecting sustainable change within the government, representing the voices of the people, and making a positive impact on their lives from within the system.

He was born on November 5, 1980, in Gum village of Gagdi Ward, Kanam Local Government Area (LGA) to the family of Mallam Adamu Yusuf and Mallama Hauwa Yusuf. He received his Islamic education from his father, which taught him the virtues of simplicity, compassion, love for humanity, hard work, and philanthropy.

He attended LEA Central Primary School, Gum-Gagdi, where he obtained his First Leaving School Certificate before he proceeded to Government Secondary School, Gagdi for his Junior Secondary Education. He later transferred to Dengi, where he had his Senior secondary education graduating in 1999. He got admitted to study Social Studies (Double Major) at Federal College Education (FCE) Pankshin, where he obtained his Nigeria Certificate in Education (NCE).

He proceeded to the University of Jos, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Economics Education. After obtaining a National Certificate in Education (NCE) he got employed at the Plateau State Teachers' Service Commission and was posted to Government Secondary Schools, West of Mines and Angwan Rogo, Jos. He was later seconded to the Office of the Head of Service of the State, where he served as a Personal Assistant to the Head of Service, the late Dr. Godfrey Mamzhi.

He holds a PGD in Conflict Management and M.Sc. in Peace and Conflict Management from the University of Jos and M.Sc. on Intelligence and Global Security, Baze University, Abuja. He is currently undergoing a PhD in Conflict Management from University of Jos.

His first sojourn in politics started with a deter-

mination to serve and learn from those in the political turf. He was mentored and served as a Legislative Aide to the then Deputy Speaker Plateau State House of Assembly, late Rt. Hon. Usman Zumunta Musa. His commitment, dedication to assigned responsibilities, meticulousness and absolute loyalty made him become a darling aide. His hard work to deliver on any given assignment was quite glaring. While working for his mentor, the late Hon. Zumunta, Hon. Gagdi took on a teaching position in Jos to support himself financially and pay for his studies at the University of Jos.

In 2010, Hon. Gagdi left the Plateau State Civil Service and started his political journey as a legislator, contesting to represent the Kantana Constituency at the Plateau State Assembly, an election which he narrowly lost in 2011. After the elections, he became the State Financial Secretary of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP). He also served as a member of the Lower Benue River Basin Development Authority governing board and eventually became the pro tem Chairman of the board. In both roles, he performed exceptionally well.

In 2015, Hon. Gagdi contested again to represent the Kantana constituency in Plateau State House of Assembly and won overwhelmingly. His colleagues and honourable members made him the Deputy Speaker of the 8th Assembly of Plateau State. He also served as the Chairman House Committee on Commerce and Industry, Plateau State and Chairman, Special Committee on Peace, Security and Reconciliation, Plateau State.

Hon. Gagdi served as a state legislator for a single term between 2015 to 2019 during which he made great strides and positive contributions to his constituency and Plateau State. As a state assembly member, Gagdi was loved by his people. He was the first state assembly member to pay for the West African Senior Examination Council (WAEC) registration for his constituents.

In 2019, he realised his potential for impactful and sustainable changes for the Nigerian people within governance and politics and decided to run to become a member of the Federal House of Representatives representing Pankshin/Kanke/Kanam. He won the elections to the

Impressively, 6 of his Bills were assented to by President Muhammadu Buhari including Admiralty University of Nigeria, Ibusa (Establishment) Act 2021, Police Act (Repeal and Re-enactment) Act 2020, Federal University of Education, Pankshin (Establishment) Act 2021, National Hydrographic Agency (Establishment) Act 2020, Maritime Security Operations Co-operation Board (Amendment) Act, 2020 and Nigerian Maritime Security Trust Fund Establishment Bill, 2021.

Under Gagdi's leadership as a member representing Pankshin/Kanke/Kanam (PKK) Federal Constituency, classes were established in schools, numerous roads were constructed, primary health care centers were built and befitting palaces were also built. In addition to earlier exploits, Gagdi introduced refund of registration fees to candidates, including a constituency wide refund for Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), West African Senior Examination Council and National Examinations Council (NECO) fees. This included the refund of external examination fees to private and missionary schools within the PKK constituency.

I thank God for granting you journey mercies to be here today, but more importantly, I would like to sincerely appreciate your presence at today's event, which further gives me the desired impetus that it can be better in the future.

Several times in the past, I stood before you at different fora, however, today's is different from others. It is the dawn of a new era for PKK.

On this occasion, apart from the unveiling of those who will power the campaign, I have the pleasure to inform you that a compendium with details of what we have been able to do in the last three and a half years will be presented also.

In this compendium, you will find that it is segmented into different areas of interventions I have done in PKK over the last three and half years. I have segmented it for the reader to appreciate the details of my assignment in Abuja for PKK.

From page one to the last; they are a report of my legislative engagements, social interventions, advocacy visits, constructions of roads, schools, palaces, recreational facilities, town halls, markets, provision of employment, and many more which made the years rewarding to all.

And without hesitation, I drove the idea relentlessly in all the 36 federal wards of PKK; we made sure everyone was satisfied with what I was doing. Today, no single individual can accuse me of being selective in citing projects and other items of empowerment to individuals and groups.

As I stand before you today, I can say with all honesty, I am not yet satisfied with what I have done. There is more in the kitty for all of our communities, no matter how inaccessible they may be. I want to reach the remotest area with development.

Our communities and people deserve the best representation. If in the past, nothing much was accessed through our representatives, you can be sure those days have been long gone. It is a new dawn, and we must do things in a manner that touches and gives meaning to every life.

We are in the period where being in Abuja confers on you not only the legitimacy for law-making, but of advocacy, oversight, and in other areas that would assist the people of the constituency and Nigeria generally.

I was elected to represent PKK and by extension serve Nigeria by making laws that promote the well-being of citizens. If through my advocacy, I was able to secure jobs, empowerment initiatives, and other extras, I should not help my constituents because I don't have any business securing jobs or constructing roads, markets, palaces, and hospitals for them?

It is difficult to find an answer because those who engage in this pastime do so on account of the changes I have brought in the last three and half years. Their opposition does not change what we have envisaged will be done in PKK.

Rather than concentrate on what those in opposition want to achieve by swaying our attention away from the people, I am more than ever resolved to pursue what will be to your benefit.

To be fair, helping people has been my second nature; and because it is in God that we trust, we have made inroads into the lives of the constituents of PKK.

If you study carefully the compendium of my three and half years in the National Assembly, you will observe that our interventions have been holistic. In this wise, we are going to leave nothing to chance.

There is room for improvement for PKK. That is why I make this solemn pledge that tomorrow shall be better. I can assure you that the problem that our communities face will continue to receive more attention.

I have a better understanding of what you need having been in the saddle for the last three and a half years. For this reason, you can expect to reap more if by God's grace I am given another opportunity.

BRIEF BACKGROUND OF PANKSHIN/KANKE/KANAM FEDERAL CONSTITUENCY

The Federal Constituency consists of three Local Government Areas in Plateau State, namely: Pankshin, Kanke and Kanam.

1.3.1 Pankshin Local Government Area

Pankshin is a Local Government Area in Plateau State, created on 3rd February 1976. Its headquarters is in the town of Pankshin. It has an area of 1,524 km² and a population of 191,685, according to the 2006 census. Pankshin is popularly known as a trade hub as most of the people are farmers, growing a vast range of food crops such as millet, guinea corn, maize, tomatoes, rice, onions, cabbage, carrot and collections of fruits. Monday in Pankshin is generally for trading – buying and selling, hence the name “Monday market” as traders, merchants and people in the environs and as far away as Bauchi come to buy and sell. The postal code of the area is 933.

Inhabited by people with diverse cultures, languages spoken in Pankshin include Ngas, Mupun, Miship, Fier, Tal, Kadung, Pal and Bijim. They are lovable people with high regard for people irrespective of colour, gender or tribe. **Predominantly populated by Ngas, other tribes are the Mupun, Miship, Fier, Tal, Kadung, Pal, and Bijim. The Hausas, Igbos, Yorubas and the Idomas are scarcely represented.

There are twelve (12) Federal Wards in Pankshin Local Government Area. Districts and communities un-

der Pankshin LGA include: Chip, Fier, Kadung, Lankan, Pankshin (Rural) and Wokkos. 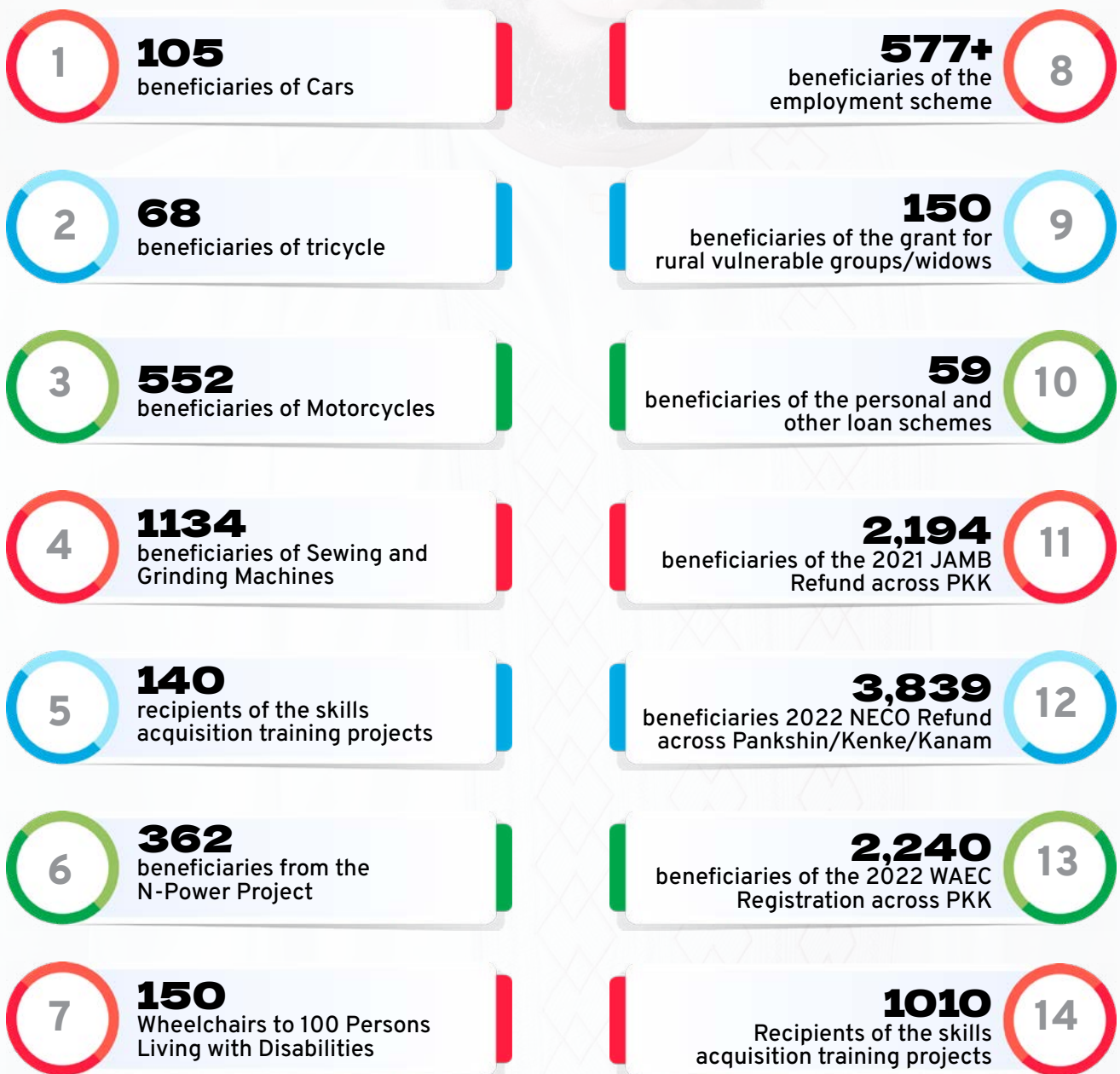
Kanam is a Local Government Area in Plateau State, Nigeria. Its headquarters is in the town of Dengi. It has an area of 2,600 km² and a population of 165,898 at the 2006 census. The postal code of the area is 940. The Bogghom language and Jhar language are spoken in the LGA. Kanam LGA has two (2) state constituencies in the Plateau State House of Assembly, namely: Dengi and Kantana. The major ethnic groups in Kanam LGA (Bogghom and Jhar) are further subdivided into three as follows; Bogghom consist of Khinpyi, Khinboghghom and Tankwal whereas the Jhar speaking people comprises of Badawa, Kantana and Garga respectively. There are significant number of Hausa, Fulani, Ngas, Tarok, Igbo, Yuruba, and others. The Local Government houses

the antient Kanam Emirate, Jhar and Bogghom chiefdoms respectively as the major traditional stools. In area of agriculture, Kanam LGA is known as the home of cotton/cattle and groundnut. Othe crops produced in high commercial quantities include beans, suya-beans, maize, millet, guineacorn, yam, casava and sweet potato.

A commitment to peace and National Security

Hon. Gagdi's commitment to ensuring peace, stability and security in Nigeria is evident in his push for policing system reforms. A focus on Constitutional Reforms

During the 9th Assembly, Gagdi's Constitutional reforms centered on two key amendments. Firstly, an increase in the retirement age for Judicial officers and related matters as outlined in Section 291 of the Constitution. Secondly, a proposed alteration to Section 215, which pertains to the appointment of the Inspector-General and control of the Nigeria Police Force.

General accomplishments

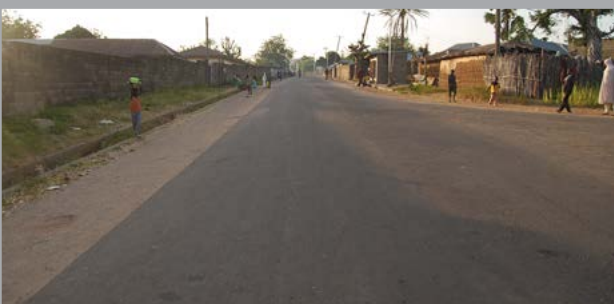




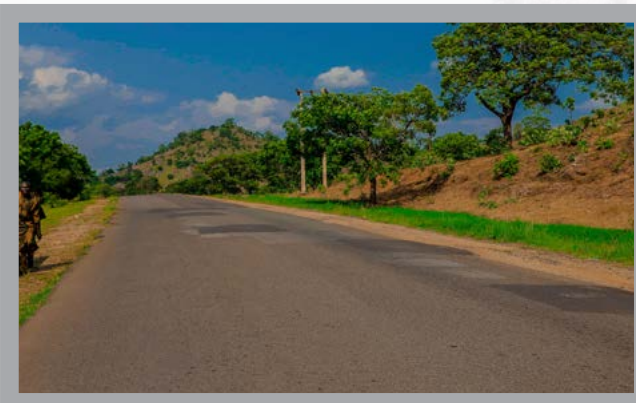
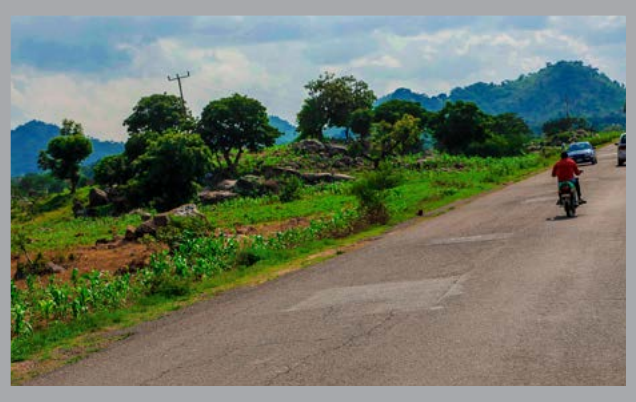
3.2 ROAD NETWORK

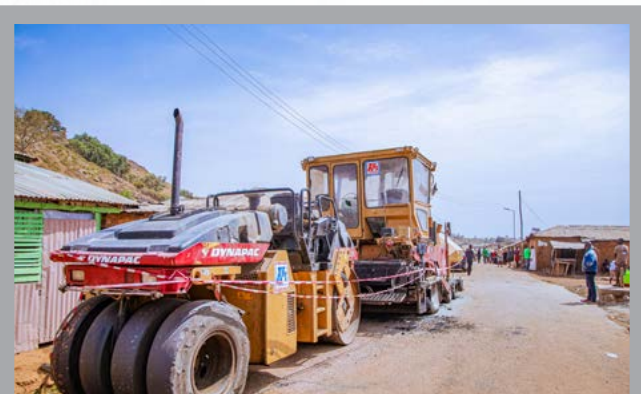

3.3 EDUCATION

Rt, Hon, Gagdi's contribute towards basic literacy and improvement in the quality of education of the children within the three Local Government Areas is so commendable. Tremendous achievements in the area of education were recorded in the implementation of the blueprint on this sector through the provision of educational facilities and Infrastructures for both Primary and Secondary Schools spreading across the Constituency.

The Rt. Hon Member sponsored the Bill that saw to the upgrading of the Federal College of Education (FCE) Pankshin to the new Federal University of Education (FUE) Pankshin. Thereafter he sponsored another Bill for the relocation of Federal College of Education Pankshin to Dengi, Kanam LGA of Plateau State.

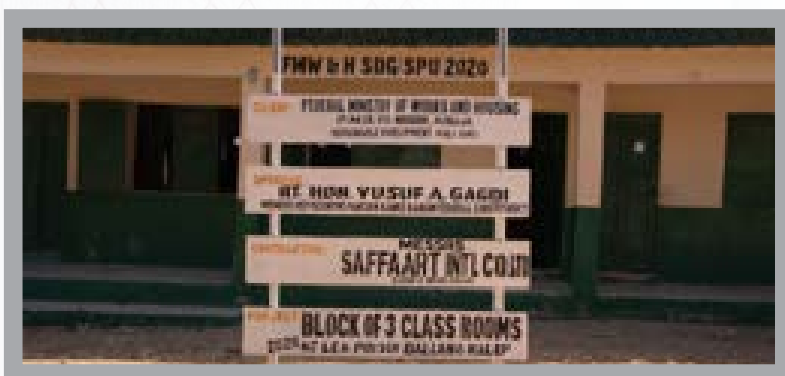

3.4 WATER SUPPLY

On water supply, Rt. Hon. Gagdi's effort is second to none in Nigeria. In his quest to address the rural water challenges facing his constituents, he procured Bore Hole drilling equipment's which was commissioned by the Executive Governor of Plateau State Rt. Hon. Simon Bako LaLong in 2020, and instantly commenced the drilling of 1 hand pump bore hole for each polling unit that makes up his constituency and a Solar motorized bore hole for each Federal ward headquarters in the three local government areas that make up his constituency.

Till date, about 200 bore holes have been sunk to the admiration of his constituents.

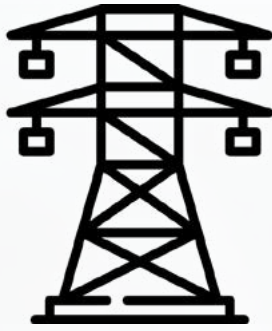

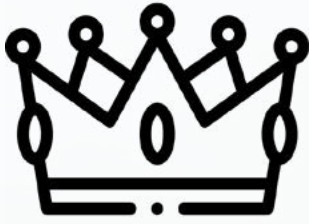

3.7 AGRICULTURE

In order to enhance agricultural development of the Constituency, Rt. Hon. 3.10 HUMAN CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT

To brilliantly cap his fascinating performance as a modern lawmaker, Rt. Hon. Gagdi first appointed over 100 aides to support in coordinating and discharging his legislative and political activities, he has also influenced the employment of over three hundred (300) persons into different Federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), as well as the Armed Forces, Police and other para-military organizations. Over eighty (80) percent of the beneficiaries of this gesture are Constituents of PKK; about ten percent of this number are citizens of Plateau State from sister Local Government Areas outside his constituency, while the rest are Nigerians from across the six geo-political zones of the country. This is a confirmation of the nexus of friendship Hon. Gagdi has cultivated across the length and breadth of Nigeria, which further accentuates his nationalist disposition.

Of the number mentioned above, one hundred and eighty (180) are gainfully employed in federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), while one hundred and thirty (130) are enlisted into the armed forces, Police and other paramilitary organizations, with different ranks; depending on the beneficiary's educational accomplishments.

Out of the one hundred and eighty (180) employed in different Federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), 155 have been in government payroll earning their monthly salaries from December 2019 while twenty-five (25) persons; seven (7) in Federal University, Lafia and eighteen (18) in Federal University, Wukari are yet to start receiving their salaries due to some peculiar problems confronting the institutions that hindered their IPPIS enrolment. The affected persons have been in possession of their letters of employment duly signed by the institution's respective registrars, hoping to have their names included in the payroll as soon as the problems are rectified.

The one hundred and eighty (180) beneficiaries in the category mentioned above are employed in the Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) listed below.

It is worth noting that out of the six officers from Plateau State enlisted into the Direct Short Service of Nigerian Navy for 2020 and 2021, five are from PKK. However, names of those enlisted in the armed forces, Police and paramilitary are not published here because of the security nature of their jobs.

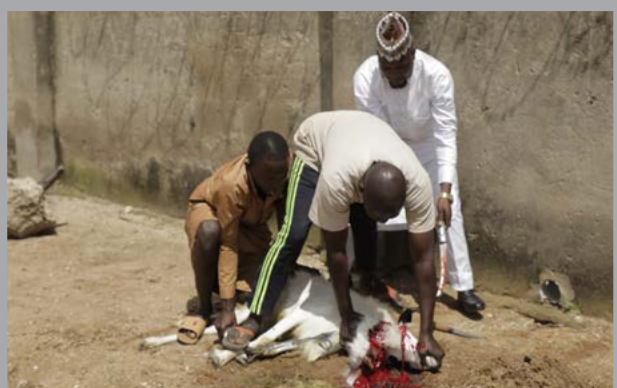
3.14 SUPPORT DURING FESTIVE PERIODS:

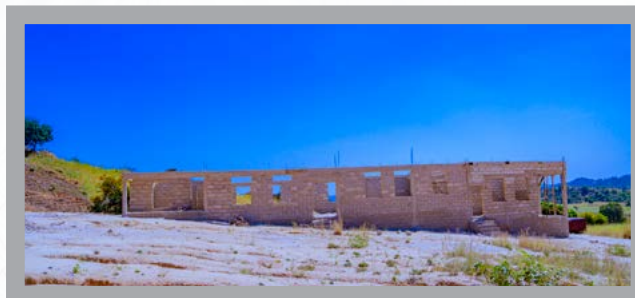
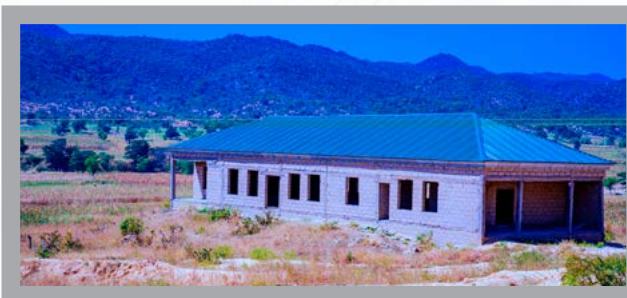
